**Re: Notification of Sanctions**

Dear Ms. Thompson:

On June 9, 2005, you appeared before the Administrative Hearing Board to discuss the charges filed against you as a result of your alleged violations of the Southeastern Louisiana University Student Code of Conduct.

This is formal notice to you that you have been found **responsible** for the following violations:

**Article IV, Section B, 1.c. and 16:**

- Unauthorized possession of University documents. This includes faculty materials related to the educational process.
- Failure to comply with the directions of a University official in the performance of his/her duties.

You are being given the following sanctions:


- Must return original journal, complete and unaltered, to the Office of Judicial Affairs by Wednesday, June 29, 2005.
- University Disciplinary Probation effective immediately and continuing through December 31, 2005.

University Disciplinary Probation removes a student from a good disciplinary standing for a designated period of time and places the student on final warning status. If the student is found to be in violation of any institutional regulation(s), particularly during the probationary period, separation from the institution may occur.

You have the right to appeal this decision and sanctions. The written request for an appeal must be filed with the Vice President of Student Affairs within five (5) working days of the date of this letter. The appeal procedures are listed on page 87 of the Southeastern Louisiana University Student Handbook.
